

That was why Martin Luther placed such a heavy emphasis on hymns in his reforming efforts, and is why the Lutheran Church today treasures and uses hymns that are explicitly "doctrinal."

Following the hymn festival (which should last less than an hour) the *Ladies of Hope* will be hosting a social time at which desserts and drinks will be served. Please plan on attending this special celebration of our Lutheran musical heritage.
